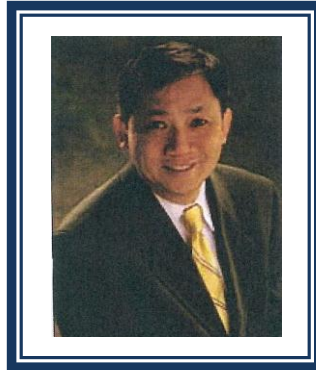

**The Charlotte Brody Award**

Kathy started with PSN on Jan. 24th this year as our new Clinic Development Specialist. Kathy is presently assigned to 8 States and oversees 42 site locations at this time. Kathy has been a registered nurse for over 30 years and has worked with large physician groups in several states. Kathy was born in Branson and also maintains a residence in Columbia. Kathy is the former Director of Oncology Still Regional Cancer Center in Jefferson City and the former Director of Marketing for Hospice Columbia Regional.

On Feb. 23rd Kathy was nominated for the Charlotte Brody Award which is sponsored by the HCWH Nurses Workgroup in conjunction with the Luminary Project, which is an effort to capture the illuminating stories of nurses' activities to improve human health by improving the health of the environment. Kathy was also nominated for this award in 2005 as an outstanding nurse in advocacy against faulty medical devices.

The stories on this website ([www.TheLuminaryProject.org](http://www.TheLuminaryProject.org)) show how nurses are creatively and strategically addressing environmental problems and illuminating the way towards safe hospitals; communities with clean air, land and water; and children born without toxic chemicals in their bodies. The Luminary Project is the collaboration of the Nurses Workgroup of Health Care Without Harm and the nurses and nursing organizations who are the Guiding Lights and Beacons for this Project.

The award seeks to recognize Nurse Luminaries who go beyond everyday nursing endeavors to proactively promote and protect environmental health, and who generate significant outcomes from their efforts.

Kathy is also the Founder and Executive Director of Toxic Discovery a Consumer Advocacy Organization that was established in 1993. Toxic Discovery, Inc. is a National Non-Profit Organization who has assisted thousands of individuals injured by faulty medical devices. Kathy has spoken in front of the FDA, IOM and numerous government oversight committees in Washington, D.C. concerning the harms of silicones and other chemical related injuries. At this time Toxic Discovery maintains a database of over 35,000 members.

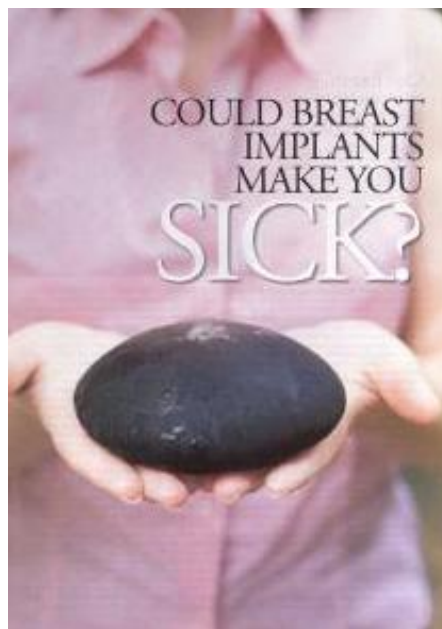
## FDA ALERTS

### **Anaplastic Large Cell Lymphoma (ALCL)**

The FDA has identified a possible association between breast implants and the development of anaplastic large cell lymphoma (ALCL), a rare type of non-Hodgkin's lymphoma. ALCL is not cancer of the breast tissue. The FDA believes that women with breast implants may have a very low but increased risk of developing ALCL adjacent to the breast implant. A literature review identified 34 unique cases of ALCL in women with breast implants worldwide. In total, the agency is aware of approximately 60 cases of ALCL in women with breast implants that were identified through the FDA's contact with other international regulatory agencies, scientific experts and breast implant manufacturers. This is a very small fraction of the 5-10 million women who have received breast implants worldwide.

Additional data is needed to fully understand the possible relationship between ALCL and breast implants. The FDA is asking health care providers to report all confirmed cases of ALCL in women with breast implants through FDA's MedWatch Program.

The documents below include the FDA's analyses of the data and steps we plan to take to better understand and characterize the possible association.

Ozarks Medical Center now provides rheumatology services five days per week in West Plains, offering quality treatment close to home for those suffering from arthritis and other diseases of the joints, muscles and bones.

The qualified physicians providing the care are Dr. Anne Winkler, Dr. Mark Jarek, Dr. Anthony Tay and Dr. Melinda Reed, all board-certified rheumatologists with Premier Specialty Network.

Zechman said since the Rheumatology program began at OMC two years ago, it has grown immensely from a one-day per week program to a full-time, five-day-a-week service. Recently, the rheumatology services moved into their own clinic space to accommodate the growing service line. Dr. Tay also provides services at OMC’s Gainesville Clinic one day per month. “The Rheumatology Clinic is fulfilling a major need in the community and we are proud to be able to provide the care the community needs right here at OMC,” Zechman said.

Rheumatologists treat arthritis, certain autoimmune diseases, musculoskeletal pain disorders and osteoporosis.

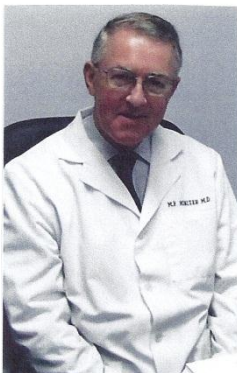

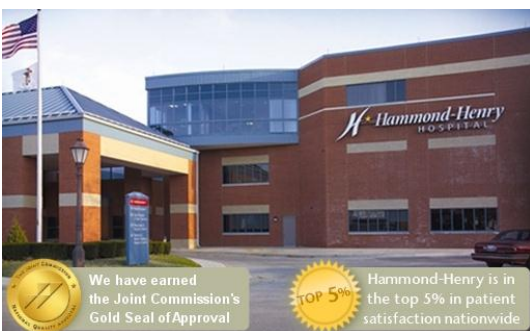

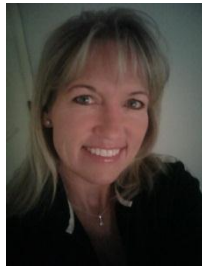
